



## Carrollwood Day School Summer Camp: COVID-19 Policies and Procedures

*Updated: Thursday, May 27, 2020*

The safety and health of campers and staff is always our top priority here at Carrollwood Day School (CDS). With the potential spread of the corona virus disease (COVID-19) within the United States, CDS has reviewed our health-related plans and procedures. We want to communicate those to you, our families and our staff members.

- We have policies and standards in place to mitigate the spread of communicable diseases. We will continue to review and enforce these policies.
- We employ personal-protection behaviors, such as proper hand washing, to help reduce exposure impacts from COVID-19, just as we do for other illnesses.
- In general, we ask that parents do not bring their children to camp who are ill. We also ask our staff not to come to camp if they are ill.
- CDS reserves the right not to admit people who pose a communicable disease risk to others.
- Our staff are trained in illness-reducing strategies, such as:
  - Appropriate hand washing and/or hand-sanitizing.
  - Cough/sneeze “into your sleeve.” Covering coughs/sneezes with one’s hands is no longer desired behavior.
  - Keeping peoples’ hands away from their faces.
  - Personal supplies – hairbrushes, pillows, caps, contact lens solutions, make-up should not be shared with others.
  - Campers who bring food and drink from home are not allowed to share with other campers.
  - Staff check the temperature of all campers daily
  - Staff isolate people with questionable symptoms until communicable illness can be ruled out.
  - Staff will alert camp administration when multiple people have similar symptoms within 3 hours.
  - Staff wear masks at all times. New/cleaned masks are used daily to ensure cleanliness. Students are encouraged to wear masks when social distancing is not applicable.
  - Staff are trained specifically to spot the symptoms of COVID-19.
  - Pick-up/Drop-off will be held at the West Side pick up. Parents are encouraged not to get out of their vehicles. Car tags must be displayed.
  - All camps/classes will be split into cohorts of 10
  - Instructors/counselors disinfect all supplies to be used daily
  - Facilities team cleans each classroom used, daily. Stronger disinfectants used in the afternoon
- We are staying abreast of recent developments by monitoring and following the recommendations of the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and Florida Health Department.
